Revelation is divided into two main parts:


Left hand: **HISTORICAL Part**Revelation 1:1 to 14:20




Right hand: **ESCHATOLOGICAI Part**Revelation 15:1 to 22:21




Revelation contains an introductory part called Prologue and a conclusion called Epilogue. Between the prologue and the epilogue the book contains 8 visions.






NAMES OF VISIONS
